

### PĀHOA TRANSIT HUB POP-UP EVENT SUMMARY

February 26, 2023, 7:00 AM – 12:00 PM Maku'u Farmer's Market

### **Event Description**

The purpose of the pop-up event was to share information about the Pāhoa Transit Hub and Library project and gather community mana'o on the preferred sites and potential design features of the Transit Hub and Library. The pop-up was hosted at Maku'u Farmer's Market and was promoted via flyers, radio ads, press releases, and the project website.

The event was intended to capture people attending the farmer's market that may not otherwise have heard about the project, as the market attracts thousands of people within the Puna region and beyond. The project team set up a colorful display and engaged passers-by by handing out fact sheets, inviting comments, and answering questions. Attendees were invited to provide their input by filling out comment cards and placing post-it notes and sticky dots on the display boards. The fact sheet and display board posters are included in the appendices of this summary.

Hundreds of people stopped by the farmers market booth to look at the boards. Flyers and fact sheets were also distributed to the farmers market vendors.



### **Display Board Comments**

The Pop-Up event was set up to enable people to learn more about the Pāhoa Transit Hub and Library project. For each site, attendees were asked to indicate their level of support for each site number by placing a sticker in one of three columns: thumbs-up, "neutral", thumbs-down. Partcipants were also asked to indicate their top three features or services the future libary could include using dot stickers. Comment cards and post its were also available for written comments. Handwritten comment cards and post its were submitted by meeting attendees and the following notes were transcribed verbatim below.

#### **Comment Card Comments**

- 1.) Site Selection
  - These sites are much better than the previous ones they were looking at that were far from the city center. (Heard about this event on Facebook)
  - Prefer existing huts near HS used as gathering place for lava evacuees. Current sites are now too congested with traffic vacant. The roundabout already breaks up when there is an accident.
  - Would prefer site across highway next to loop (see yellow dot)

- Richard Solie landowner (need dot) (referred by Claude)










### **Attachment A: Site Dot Voting Results**







#### **Project Overview**

The County of Hawai'i Transit and Multi-Modal Transportation Master Plan (Master Plan) was completed in August 2018. One of the goals of the Master Plan was to "Create transportation hubs and bus stops with amenities that provide rider comfort and safety and that help support community and village gathering places." To implement this goal, the County of Hawai'i Planning Department and Mass Transit Agency (the Department and MTA) are initiating the planning phase of a Transit Hub in the Pāhoa region.

In addition, the County entered into discussions with the Hawai'i State Public Library System (HSPLS) regarding co-location of the transit hub with a new State library. HSPLS intends to construct a new library in the Pāhoa region and desires to support the County's Transit-Oriented-Development (TOD) initiatives and explore the possibility of co-locating the library with the future transit center. Co-location of these key public services will enhance the ability of both facilities to serve the Pāhoa community and advance TOD principles.
