

Lower Honoapi'ilani Road Complete Streets & Roadway Improvements

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The County of Maui Department of Public Works (DPW) is proposing improvements along Lower Honoapi'ilani Road in West Maui. The improvements are intended to address multimodal safety, accessibility, and resilience along the corridor. Three projects are currently in various stages of planning and implementation:

- 1 Lower Honoapi'ilani Road Complete Streets Improvements
- 2 Lower Honoapi'ilani Road Pavement Rehabilitation
- 3 Ka'opala Bay Shoreline Erosion Mitigation

COMPLETE STREETS IMPROVEMENTS

Extent: Ho'ohui Road to Napilihau St.

Lower Honoapi'ilani Road functions as a major collector providing access to residential areas, beachgoers, resorts and various utility services. DPW is initiating the planning phase of a complete streets project to make the street safer for people of all ages and abilities while traveling on foot, by bicycle, in a personal motor vehicle, or by bus.

In keeping with the principles of "complete streets", which aims to prioritize the safety of vulnerable users while balancing the needs of all other modes, the County is proposing measures that will calm traffic speeds through the area while providing facilities to improve safety, visibility, and access for people walking and riding bicycles.

The project team will collect and analyze data, study existing transportation patterns, and collect input from community members and stakeholders to identify and design solutions to balance the needs of all users. See the following page for examples of complete streets improvements.

OTHER ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS

Road Pavement Rehabilitation

Extent: Ho'ohui Road to Napilihau St.

DPW is completing a Road Pavement Rehabilitation Project for Lower Honoapi'ilani Road and scheduled for completion in 2024.

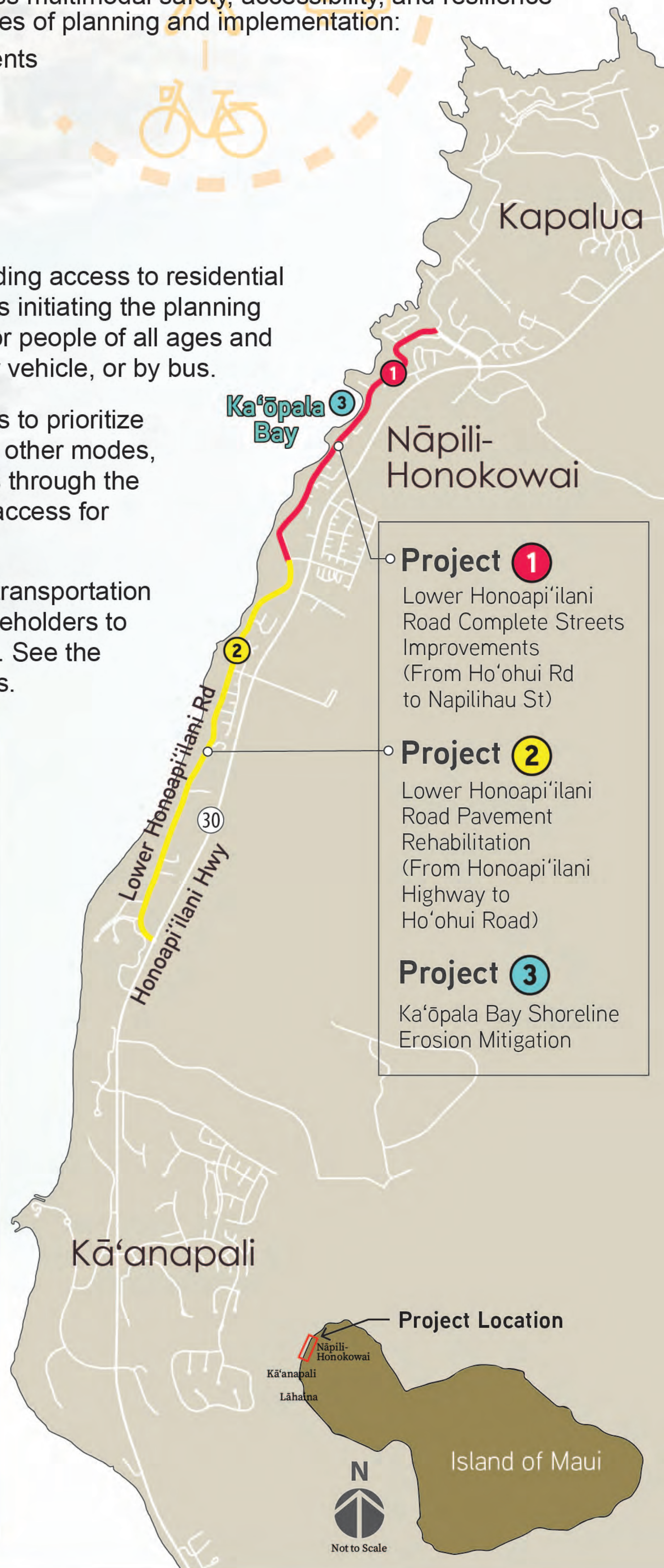
The project will address deficiencies in the road corridor by:

- Resurfacing the pavement
- Replacing the pavement striping and speed tables,
- Replacing signs and damaged guardrails.

The project also seeks to ensure compliance with Americans with Disabilities Act standards by reconstructing non-compliant curb ramps and sidewalks.

Ka'opala Bay Shoreline Erosion Mitigation

The accelerated coastal erosion at Ka'opala Bay is undermining the structural integrity of the Lower Honoapi'ilani Road, which poses major risks to underground and overhead utilities. The objective of this project is to develop a sustainable and resilient approach by implementing engineered solutions to protect the highway in the short to mid term while longer term solutions are developed. This project builds on previous studies conducted by DPW, Munekiyo Hiraga, and Fukumoto Engineering between 2016 and 2022.



PROPOSED COMPLETE STREETS SOLUTIONS

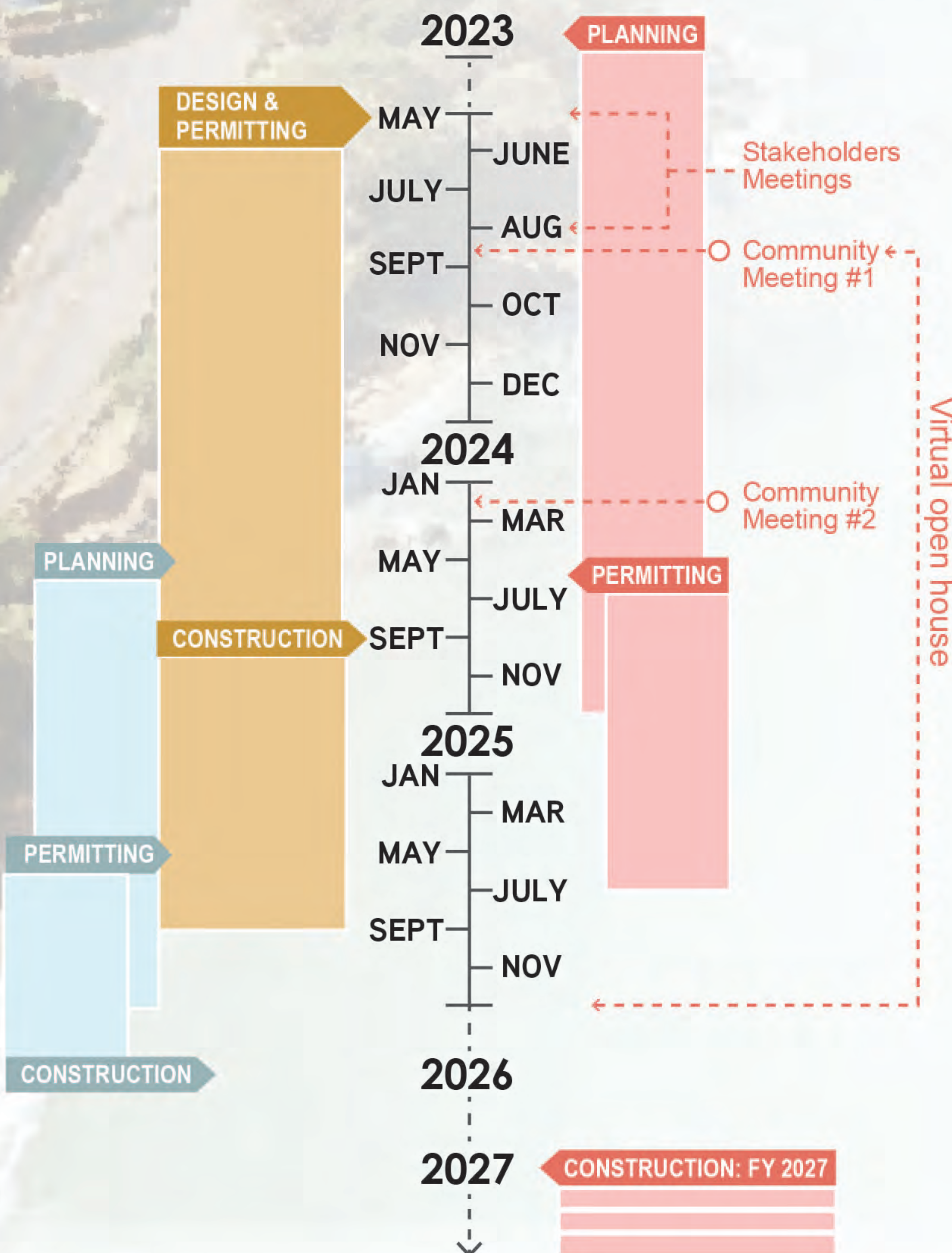
The Lower Honoapi'ilani Road Complete Streets Project will consist of designing and constructing "complete streets" type improvements, along with reconstructing portions of the roadway. The complete streets improvements under consideration may vary depending on community input and the width of the roadway which varies along the corridor. Complete streets improvements could include: sidewalks, pedestrian crossing improvements, bicycles facilities, shared use path, route and wayfinding guidance, traffic calming, landscaping, and stormwater drainage.

SCHEDULE *

1: Lower Honoapi'ilani Road Complete Streets Improvements

2: Lower Honoapi'ilani Road Pavement Rehabilitation

3: Ka'ōpala Bay Shoreline Erosion Mitigation

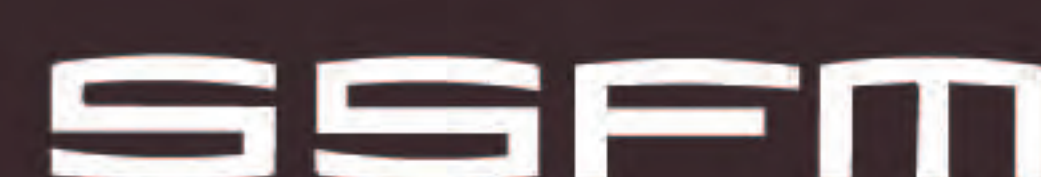
